Terrain Parks

Snowmass boasts three rad terrain parks - Scooper, Little Makaha, and Pipeline -- to quench your shreddin' needs. These parks cater to all abilities.

Beginner Shredders: Scooper is accessed via the Village Express lift and has a few rollers, boxes and little rails for those that are just getting started. The Scooper poma lift serves this park.

Mid-Level Shredders: Located under the Elk Camp Gondola is Little Makaha. This park is for you if you're just getting comfortable in the air and the jumps aren't too big. Little Makaha has medium-sized bumps, boxes, rails, rollers and banks. A beginner pipe is on the lower level.

No-Joke Shredders: Do you have the mad-shredding skills required for Pipeline? Only way to find out... hit it. Complete with lift access and a booming sound system, the Coney Glade area is home to the Pipeline halfpipe and terrain park, geared for advanced riders. The Pipeline half pipe is kept in top condition by a Pipe Dragon groomer and is constructed to world-class competition specifications.

Feel like taking it to the next level? Our pros at the Ski and Snowboard School of Aspen/Snowmass can have you ripping the pipe and riding the rails in no time. Don't want to trash your skis on the rails? Demo some freeride skis or a board from Pro Mountain Sports or D&E Snowboards.

Famous for its history, diverse terrain, amazing restaurants and legendary nightlife, Snowmass is one of the most well-known resort destinations in the world. Four mountains - Snowmass, Aspen Mountain, Aspen Highlands and Buttermilk - rise up from the Roaring Fork Valley, offering a combined 5,285 acres which include eight terrain parks, including a 22 foot superpipe, four halfpipes and 336 marked trails via 46 lifts. Snowmass is located 220 miles southwest of Denver, and is easily accessible by convenient mountain airports - Aspen/Pitkin County and Eagle County (70 miles from Aspen/Snowmass).

Sunday night's 1.3 rating and 1,242,210 homes makes it the highest-rated and most-viewed Winter X Games telecast ever.
